Holocaust

The systematic, state-sponsored murder of six million Jewish people by Nazi Germany and its collaborators during World War II (1933–1945).

Concentration Camp

A prison camp operated by the Nazis where people were imprisoned without trial and subjected to forced labor, starvation, abuse, and death.

Racism

The belief that one race is superior to another, often resulting in discrimination, violence, or unfair treatment.

Antisemitism

Hatred of, prejudice against, or discrimination toward Jewish people.

Bigotry

Strong, unreasonable intolerance or hatred toward people who are different based on race, religion, or beliefs.

Boycott

A nonviolent protest in which people refuse to buy, use, or participate in something to demand change or justice.

Ghetto

An area where Jewish people were forced to live during Nazi rule, often overcrowded and tightly controlled, before deportation to camps.

Civil Rights

The rights of citizens to political and social freedom and equality, including protection from discrimination.

Star of David

A six-pointed star that is a symbol of Judaism. During the Holocaust, Jews were forced to wear it to identify and isolate them.



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
